Agenda

- 1. 15 minutes silent reading
- 2. Introduce ballad using the PowerPoint presentation.
- 3. Introduce an example of ballad "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner" by British romantic poet Samuel Coleridge
- 4. Discuss the meaning of the title
 - Rime Frost formed on cold objects by the rapid freezing of water vapor.
 - Mariner A sailor
- 5. Pass out copies of the lyrics and show a few minutes of the video of Iron Maiden's Rime
 - http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WfNAiPpApx4
- 6. Ask students to analyze the lyrics stanza-by-stanza. Go over the first few stanzas as a group and then allow students to analyze the last few independently or in pairs
 - Ask students to fill out the bottom section of their handout "Quiz Yourself"
 - Review these answers with the full group
- 7. After going over these general answers with the whole class, give students 10-15 minutes to fill out the poem analysis worksheet
- 8. After break, gives students time to finish up their analysis worksheets and ask for volunteers to share their answers.
- 9. Project one of Dore's images on the overhead
- 10. Like the songwriter, use Coleridge's story to write your own poem.
- 11. Give students class time to work together to write poems summing up the story being told in the image.
- 12. If time permits have students share their poem summaries along with their images near the end of class.

<u>Assessment</u>

 The poem analysis worksheet and discussion will assess students' comprehension of the poem
